After the incident Diksha got married to Sandeep and they both had a boy kid named asAbhay.Diksha after her marriage she became a mother who

Diksha's mother-in-law is actualsympathetic and helpful. She set the manner for the self-motivated between both from day one, and was a source of comfort and strength as she bumbled around trying to figure out what this whole marriage/motherhood thing was all about. Generally mother in-laws are not very supportive but Diksha's mother in law is very supportive. Diksha's Mother – in – law says, "You know, I felt much the same way. I too got married to Sandeep's father, way too early. I have never ever lived my life or done things for myself. But that was okay for women of that generation. Certainly not of your generation," (122).

I know I want him more than anything else. But I lack the courage to say this to Sandeep. I am terrified of the repercussions and I am terrified of facing his wrath" (212).
